2008/2009 PROGRAMS FUNDED

Central VT Community Action (CVCAC): United Way supports their “Emergency” fund. This fund provides financial assistance to people during emergency and/or crisis situations (housing, food and fuel assistance). Many of these people receive case management assistance, budget counseling and referrals to improve their current situations.

Lamoille Home Health & Hospice: UWLC funds its “Homemaker” program, helping older residents with basic needs, such as meal preparation, laundry, vacuuming, grocery shopping, and so on, so they can continue to live in their own homes as long as possible.

Lamoille County Court Diversion: United Way funding is used to support their Truancy Project, which works to reduce delinquency through restorative processes.

Clarina Howard Nichols Center: UW helps with general support of the shelter. The Center helps women and children who are victims of domestic violence and abuse.

Meals on Wheels: Meals on Wheels delivers 39,000+ hot, nutritious meals per year to elderly and disabled people.

Retired Senior Volunteer Program: RSVP & Volunteer Center of Lamoille Valley coordinate volunteer services to local organizations. RSVP & the Volunteer Center recruit volunteers of all different ages. These volunteers save our community tens of thousands of dollars each year.

Maple Leaf Farm (located in Underhill): Funding helps Lamoille County residents overcome their alcohol or chemical dependency. Again, United Way monies are used only for their Lamoille County patients.

Lamoille Family Center: UW funds their “Learning Together” program, an alternative program for pregnant and parenting teens (up to age 22) to continue their education and receive their high school diploma or GED certificate. On-site childcare and transportation assistance is available.
